Prohibition of telling blasphemous or bawdy jokes

The third question of Fatwa no. 6592

Q 3: Some people speak words that are tantamount to Kufr (disbelief) or Fisq (flagrant violation of Islamic law) and justify it by saying: I am just joking. Are such people pardoned for doing so if they are only joking?

A: It is strictly prohibited to tell blasphemous or bawdy jokes. Allah (Exalted be He) says: (If you ask them (about this), they declare: "We were only talking idly and joking." Say: "Was it at Allâh (وجل and His Ayât (proofs, evidence, verses, lessons, signs, revelations) and His Messenger (صلى) that you were mocking?") (Make no excuse; you disbelieved after you had believed.)

Those who behave as such should make Tawbah (repentance to Allah) of it and ask Allah for forgiveness in the hope that Allah may pardon them.

May Allah grant us success! May peace and blessings be upon our Prophet Muhammad, his family, and Companions!
