The Prophet (صَلَّى اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ) said,

"There is no supplication that a person can say that is better than:

'O Allaah! I ask You for al-Mu'aafaah* in this world and the Hereafter.'"

*('Mu'aafaah is for Allaah to suffice you against needing the people, and sufficing the people of having need of you. See Tuhfatul-Ahwadhi, 3512.)
