Shaykh Ibn Uthaymeen (رَحِمَهُ اللهُ)¹ said, “The last of all of the Companions to die was ‘Aamir ibn Waathilah al-Laithee in the year 110 AH. The last of them to die in Madeenah was Mahmood ibn ar-Rabi’ in 99 AH. In Damascus, Syria, the last of them to die was Waathilah ibn al-Asqa’ in 86 AH. The last of them to pass away in Basrah was Anas ibn Maalik in 93 AH. In Homs it was ‘Abdullaah ibn Busr al-Maazinee in 98 AH; in Kufah, ‘Abdullaah ibn Abee Awfaa al-Aslamee in 87 AH and the last of them to pass away in Egypt was ‘Abdullaah ibn al-Haarith in 89 AH.” (رضي الله عنهم)^{2 3}
