Sometimes people make mistakes in their prayer.

We don't want to do that.

Let us talk about some of the things which people get wrong in the prayer.<sup>1</sup>





When we pray, we face our whole body towards the Ka`bah in Makkah.

We should not turn around with our face to look in other directions<sup>2</sup> – unless we really really need to.

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## We don't look up at the sky.3


We don't look at different things on the wall or at toys in our room.



We look in one place and we don't look around.



We don't pray our whole prayer with our eyes shut.



We are allowed to shut our eyes if we need to.<sup>4</sup>

And we are allowed to blink!

We don't lean on the wall, or on anything else during the prayer.



If we cannot stand up when we pray – maybe because we are poorly - then we are allowed to sit down.



When we make *sujood* we do not put our arms flat on the floor.



We don't want to be like dogs who put their legs on the ground like that.<sup>5</sup>

When we pray, we move anything in front of us that might disturb our prayer – like a poster with lots of interesting things on it that we might end up looking at and reading.




We want to be thinking about Allah when we pray, and not about a drawing.



We definitely do not have pictures of people or animals in front of us when we pray.

Other things on the wall in front of us are OK so long as they do not disturb us during our prayer.





We should not pray when we need to go to the toilet. We should go to the toilet first, then make our *wudhoo*, then pray.



Otherwise we might not be able to concentrate properly during the prayer.



We also don't pray our prayer when we are hungry and our Mum or Dad has served the food for us to eat.





We also don't play around with our clothes or our hair or things in our pocket whilst we are praying.



We have good manners when we pray because we are speaking to Allah.

And Allah listens to us.



So when we pray, we have to remember that we are standing in front of Allah.



We don't want to do anything that might make us forget that.



May Allah make us able to pray our prayers in the right way and only for Him – aameen.
