

The Jews (Bani Israel), Mentioned in the Quran



1) Historical reasons

Many Prophets were from the Children of Israel, Jews.

The Quran often mentions the Jews because many Prophets were sent from among them such as: Prophet Abraham, Prophet Isaac, Prophet Jacob, Prophet Joseph, Prophet Moses, Prophet Aaron, Prophet David, Prophet Solomon, Prophet Zechariah, Prophet John, and Prophet Jesus, peace be upon them all.

Their history is full of lessons for humanity about faith, obedience, and disobedience.

Allah says:

O Children of Israel! Remember My favors which I bestowed upon you.

Quran, Surah Al Baqarah, 2-40

2) Their behavior serves as lessons for all nations.

The Quran mentions their mistakes not to insult them, but to warn others not to repeat those same errors.

Examples:

Disobeying God's commands like:

Fishing on the Sabbath Surah Al Baqarah, 2-65.

Rejecting or even killing prophets Al Baqarah, 2-61. Aal Imran, 3-21

Altering or hiding parts of the Scripture Al Baqarah, 2-75

These stories are moral lessons, not condemnation of an entire people.

3) Jews lived during the Prophet Muhammad's S.A.V. time.

Several Jewish tribes lived in Madinah during the Prophet's time e.g. Banu Qurayzah, Banu Nadir, Banu Qaynuqa.

They interacted directly with the Prophet S.A.V. sometimes questioning or debating him.

The Qur'an responded to their doubts and corrected misunderstandings about faith and revelation.

So, their mention in the Quran is often contextual, addressing real events of that time.

4) To show Allah's justice and mercy

The Quran also praises the righteous among the Jews.

Among them is a community on the right path. they recite Allah's verses during the night and prostrate in prayer, Aal Imran, 3-113

This means the Quran does not condemn all Jews, but distinguishes between the sincere believers and those who turned away.

5) The Quran confirms and corrects earlier revelations:

The Jewish scripture is the Torah (Tawrah), and the Qur'an describes itself as confirming the truth found in previous books.

It, the Quran, confirms what came before it, Al Baqarah, 2-97

So, the Quran speaks about the Jews too.

Affirm the truth in their revelation.

Correct distortions

Call them back to pure monotheism, belief in one God.
